Steps	Questions to Ask	Possible Strategies
1. Identify the Issue	<ul><li>What is the issue about?</li><li>Define the issue</li></ul>	Ask questions to differentiate the issue from another
2. Define the scope of the issue and identify stakeholders.	<ul> <li>Is this local, national, or global in scope?</li> <li>Are there connections among the three levels?</li> <li>What individuals or groups are or will be impacted and why?</li> </ul>	Conduct preliminary research (e.g. surveys)
3. What do you currently know about the issue? (purpose is to identify gaps)	What are all the aspects of this issue?	<ul><li>Use a web diagram</li><li>Brainstorm</li></ul>
4. Frame the issue.	What are the environmental, social, cultural, political, and economic implications?	Use these headings to list aspects
5. Intensive Research	<ul> <li>What sources do I need to consult to fill in missing information?</li> <li>Should I conduct my own primary research?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Examine various types of mainstream and alternative media</li> <li>Consult international and non-governmental organizations</li> <li>Conduct own research using interviews, surveys, and fieldwork</li> </ul>
6. Organize new information into a preferred structural framework.	What organizational format best suits my needs?	Use a graphic organizer, a chart, or other organizational structure.
7. Analyze the information you have collected	<ul> <li>Have I considered all points of view?</li> <li>Am I leaving any questions unanswered?</li> <li>Have I separated fact from opinion?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Assess the credibility of each source of information</li> <li>Analyze statistics</li> <li>Identify trends and patterns.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Are there viewpoints I have not considered?</li> <li>Have I challenged commonly held assumptions?</li> <li>What relationships exist between people and the environment?</li> <li>Do I understand the environmental, social, political, and economic contexts associated with the issue?</li> <li>Have I used the best sources?</li> <li>Do I have the information I need to come to an informed conclusion?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Look for significant relationships</li> <li>Evaluate the evidence that supports each point of view.</li> </ul>
8. Draw conclusions.	What conclusions can I reach about this issue, based on my analysis and evaluation?	Draw logical conclusions from your research based on your arguments and supporting evidence.
