## **Team Debate**

PROPOSITION: Be it resolved that, 'Globalization is a positive development for the world community'

## **FORMAT**

The 'Affirmative' team is in favour of the proposition. The 'Negative' team is against the stated proposition. A round of team debate consists of eight speeches. The first four speeches are called constructive speeches, because the teams are perceived as laying out their most important arguments during these speeches. The last four speeches are called rebuttals, because the teams are expected to extend and apply arguments that have already been made, rather than make new arguments.

The following is a table of the eight speeches and their time limits:
